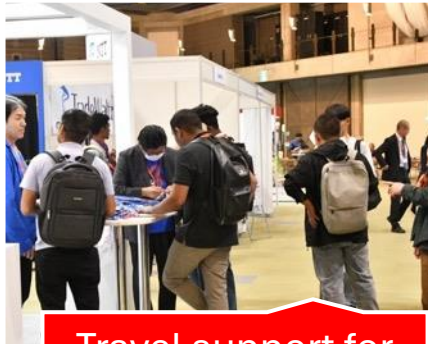

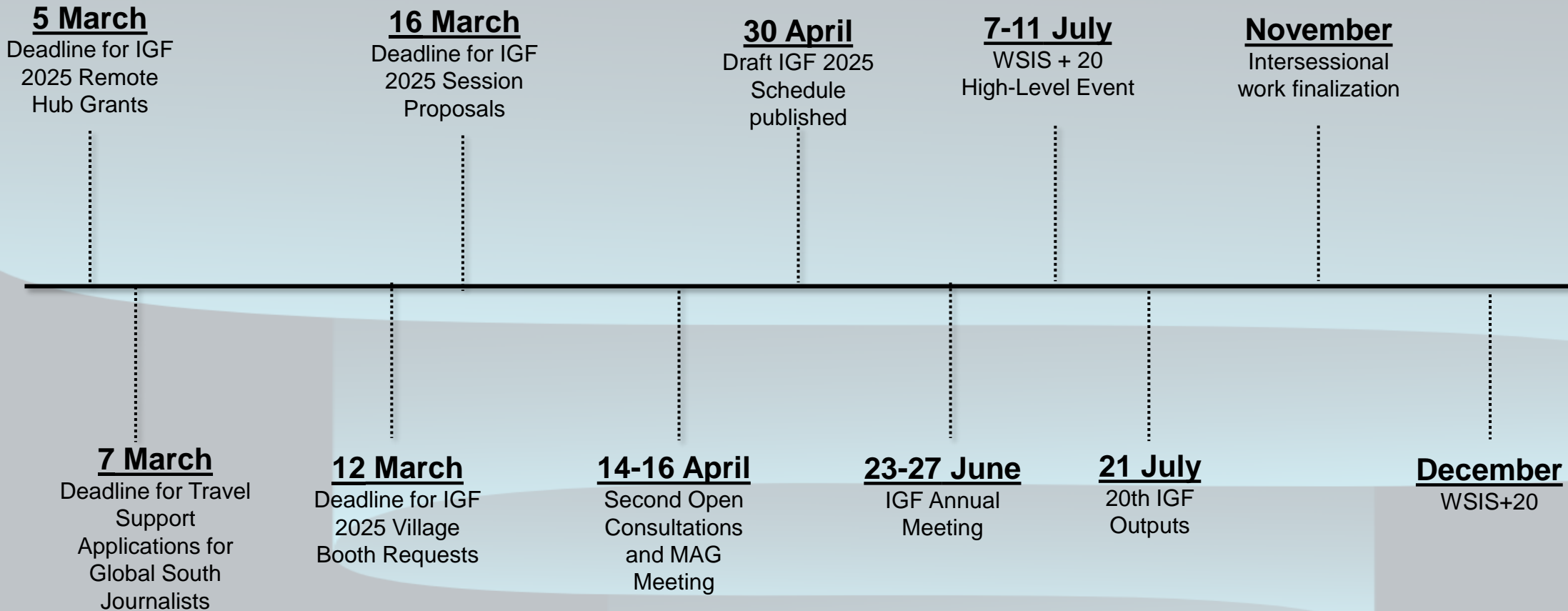
Session Types

- **Workshops** as community-organized multistakeholder interactive sessions;
- **Open Forums**, sessions organized by governments, treaty-based international organisations, and global organisations with international scope and presence, with operations across regions, dealing with Internet governance issues;
- **Launches and Awards**, sessions to present and discuss Internet governance-related academic and/or research initiatives or outputs such as research or think tank work, book launches and similar;
- **Lightning Talks**, brief, to-the-point, prepared presentations on a specific Internet governance issue;
- **Networking Sessions**, gatherings of stakeholders interested in the same or similar issue;
- **DC Sessions**, as collaborative sessions organized by multistakeholder teams of different DCs;
- **NRIs Sessions**, as collaborative sessions organized by multistakeholder teams of NRIs coming from different regions;
- **Intersessional work sessions**, organized by the facilitators of IGF Best Practice Forums and Policy Networks;
- **Music Night**,
- **Pre-events**, sessions hosted on the day before the IGF official programme begins.
- **IGF Village booths** – exhibition booths where organizations can showcase their non-commercial Internet governance-related work

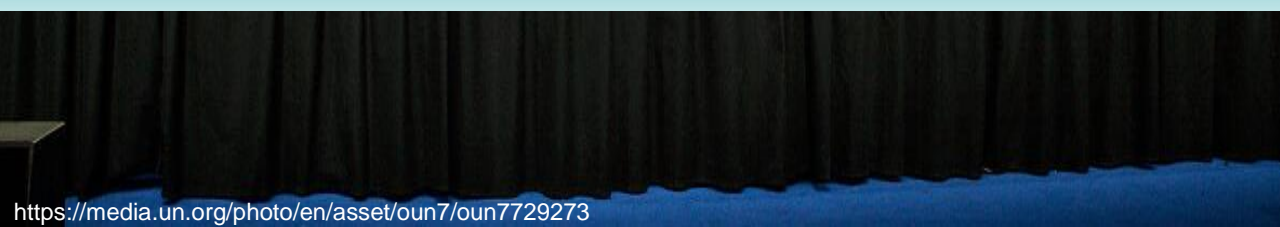


IGF+20 & WSIS+20

General Assembly Resolution A/70/125 called for a high-level meeting in 2025 to review the overall implementation of the World Summit on the Information Society (WSIS) outcomes, a process known as the WSIS+20 Review. Currently in its third mandate, the IGF and its extension will once again be a critical aspect of the upcoming WSIS+20 review process in 2025.



Forward looking: IGF beyond 2025



- Para 28/29/68/74
- Para 68 particularly mentions a role of the IGF's National & Regional Initiatives
- Leadership Panel and MAG have produced strategic papers.
- Commit to working with the CSTD, ITU, ODET, UNESCO, UNDP, Regional commissions etc.
- Each of our various intersessional streams has been asked to submit a one-pager on how they can contribute to the goals in the GDC.
- IGF continues to serve as a multistakeholder, open and inclusive platform for stakeholder engagement.
- IGF plans to contribute to the WSIS+20 review through the agreed modalities
